
Hello, Washington DECA! The Career Development team wishes you all the best for your upcoming Area Conferences.

GETTING AHEAD- A RACING START

Want to hit the ground running? There's no better way than with pre-competition preparation. As you prepare for the varying conferences ahead of you this year, considering these tips will give you an extra boost on the race track!

Before the competition, make sure to eat and drink enough. Sleep is a necessity to any successful DECA competitor. It can be tempting to stay up late, nervously reviewing practice role plays or presentation notes but a little extra sleep goes a long way. No matter how good of a racer you are, no one can run without fuel.

The right outfit can help make you feel more confident and self-assured, or simply a little more comfortable. 
